WOMEN ASSUME LEAD IN 'DUNN BEAUTIFUL'

Town Commissioners Make Provisions for Civic Improvements There

(Special to The Star) DUNN, Feb. 9.—Issuance of \$50,000 municipal bonds for the completion of water improvements, sewer and street extensions; removal of the cotton market from Lucknow square, which is to be turned over to the women's club for conversion into a public park; adoption of a suitable type of shade tree to take the place of those which must be removed from the street, and the issuance of at least \$10,000 for school improvement, purposes were among the matters receiving consideration at the meeting of the board of town commissioners in its regular monthly meeting.

In the matter of school bonds members of the school board, meeting with the commissioners to fill the places of two school trustees whose terms had expired, concurred, although it was decided to defer calling the necessary election until it is found what school measures suggested by State Commissioner of Education Brooks are adopted by this session of the legislature.

Part of the \$50,000 to be derived from the sale of bonds will be devoted to the equipping of a new pumping station to be erected under the municipal water tank, where an artesian well was drilled last fall. All electrically operated automatic pumps will be installed there at an early date to relieve the pressure at the central station and to give the town greater protection against fire.

Expected opposition to the removal of the cotton yard failed to materialize. There was not a dissenter present when a committee from the Women's club headed by the mayor's mother, Mrs. J. J. Wade and including Mrs. J. E. Crockett, Mrs. McD. Holliday and Mrs. L. E. Stephens, announced that they had come for the cotton yard. Commissioner Dunn moved that "we give it to 'em." His associates, Jones, Newberry and Goldstein, seconded the motion simultaneously. It was adopted immediately.

DURHAM COMMISSIONERS FAVOR RURAL POLICE BILL

Accede to Request of Two Hundred Citizens

(Special to The Star) DURHAM, Feb. 9.—Durham county commissioners upon petition of more than 200 citizens have gone on record as endorsing the R. O. Everett rural police bill, for the establishment of a rural police system in Durham county.

Until the indorsement by commissioners passage of the bill had been considered doubtful. Following this indorsement Representative Everett announced that he will put forth every effort to have the bill passed by the legislature.

City Aldermen definitely announced their intention of staging a fight to the finish campaign for a reduction in gas rates, regardless of action taken by any other municipality in North Carolina. For the past few days Mayor M. E. Newsom and members of the aldermanic board have been besieged by citizens who are protesting against high bills for gas. One citizen told the aldermen that his bill last month amounted to more than \$70 where it had been only \$18 prior to the increase recently allowed by the corporation commission.

HISTORIC RELIC GIVEN

Latch From General Marion's House Given Marion, S. C. (Special to The Star) MARION, S. C., Feb. 9.—A window latch from the manor house, "Belle Isle," the home of Gen. Francis Marion was recently presented to the town of Marion which bears his name.

The latch will be kept at the Marion library. It has been viewed by many of the citizens of the town and will be carefully and lovingly preserved as a memento of the famous Revolutionary general often called the "Swamp Fox," who, not only frequented this vicinity and gave Marion its name, but did much toward securing the independence of the American people. The latch was first proffered Col. J. Monroe Johnson of this place who suggested that the relic be given to the town instead. Mr. Haske secured it from the plantation in Berkeley county. The house in which General Francis Marion lived and from which the latch came is still standing and in good conditions. It is occupied by descendants of one of the general's brothers. He, himself, was never married.
