(Special to the Star.) Clinton, December 31.—The Sampson County Alumni Association of the University of North Carolina, held its holiday banquet at the Montague hotel, Clinton, December 29, 1922. L. C. Kerr, the secretary of the association had spared no efforts in corraling the Alumni for this jollification. After the several toasts were responded to, the toastmaster, Fitzhugh Whitefield, turned the meeting over to L. C. Kerr for the business session. Fitzhugh Whitefield and Fannie E. Vann were elected president and secretary respectively for the year 1923. The important business of the evening was called for by Dr. E. C. Lee, who asked for a discussion of the proposed medical school for the state. This discussion was led by Fannie E. Vann, an alumna of Trinity and a former student at the university. Col. C. M. Faircloth, H. E. Falson, Dr. Kerr and others. T. H. Lee made the following motion:

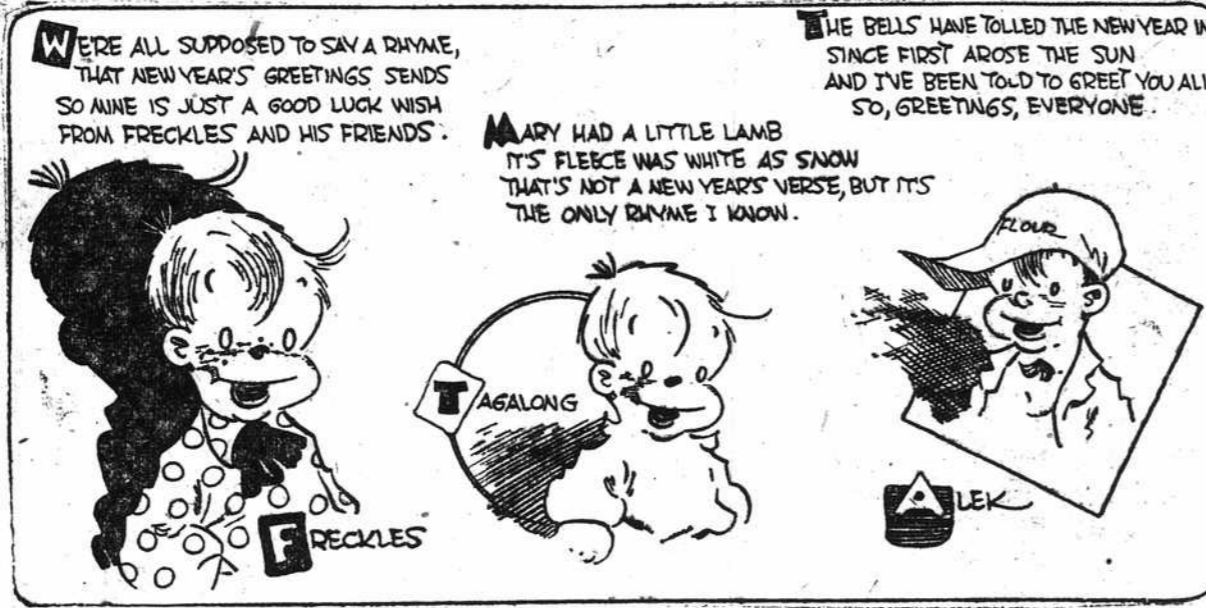
"That it is the sentiment of the Sampson County Alumni association of the University of North Carolina that the state of Trinity college, and others, for a great state medical college." This motion was seconded by Dr. J. D. Kerr, one of Sampson county's foremost physicians, and unanimously adopted by the association. Whereupon, Col. Faircloth made the motion: "That the resolution just adopted be drawn up in its proper form and a copy be sent to the Governor of North Carolina, ex-officio, chairman of the board of trustees of the University of North Carolina, and a copy to Dr. E. C. Brooks, state superintendent of public instruction; and that a copy be sent for publication to the following papers: The Alumni Review, The Charlotte Observer, The News and Observer, The Greensboro Daily, The Morning Star, The Sampson Democrat, and The News Dispatch." This motion was seconded by L. C. Kerr and unanimously adopted by the association.

Opening of Morris Plant Here Delayed

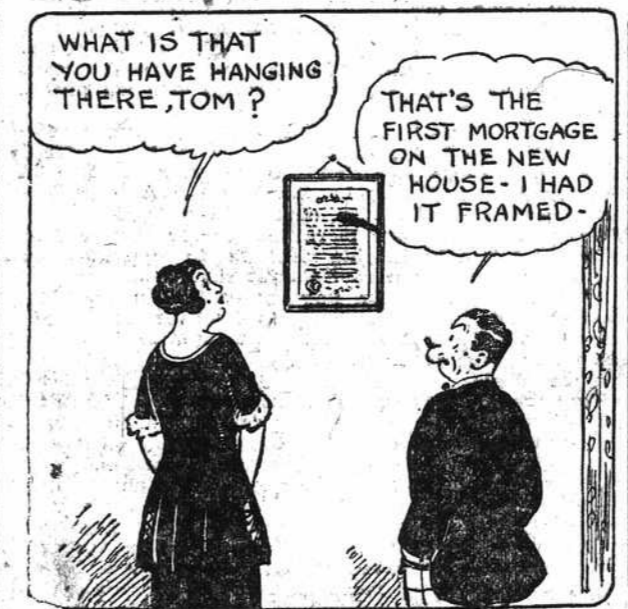
