Arson Case Opens in Forsyth County Court

WINSTON-SALEM, Jan. 10.—The greater part of the session of superior court here today was devoted to efforts to select a jury in the case of C. M. Sawyer and Willie Chatman, charged with arson in connection with the burning in August, 1922, of a large business structure here.

Chatman was arrested a few minutes after the fire and, according to the police, made a confession, claiming that he acted as an arsonist for Sawyer. Chatman has been in jail several months awaiting trial. Sawyer has been out under bond of \$20,000. About 30 veniremen were examined today but the list of jurors had not been complete when court adjourned late this afternoon. Both Chatman and Sawyer have entered pleas of not guilty.

NEW BERN, Jan. 10.—Entering a plea of guilty to charge of breaking into the home of two negro men at Vanceboro, Jesse and Hampton Fillingame, white, will be allowed to leave the state on condition they pay \$150 damages to the negroes under penalty of 15 years in the state penitentiary, according to the sentence of Judge Henry A. Grady, in superior court.

Ernest M. Green appeared for the defendants and was successful in getting Solicitor Jessie Davis to accept the plea before any evidence was brought out. After Judge Grady accepted the plea testimony of the negroes showed that the Fillingames while under the influence of whiskey had broken the door of the negroes' home and had driven them out of the house with shots from a gun.

Two penitentiary terms and a 12 months road sentence were handed out by Judge Grady during the second day of his first superior court here. Willie Williams, a negro, convicted of house-breaking, brought upon himself a penitentiary sentence of two years when he complained about a heavy road sentence; the other state prison sentence was given Louis Smith, a negro, convicted of larceny.
