Markets Remain Remarkably Firm Despite Conditions Resulting From French Invasion

NEW YORK, Jan. 14 .- (By The Associated Press).—In a week, during which the European situation has held an unusual degree of attention, the domestic markets have remained re-markably firm. France's decision to take independent action against Germany, and the actual movement of French troops into the Ruhr valley, are events which have been long awaited and whose affect upon the various markets has long been debated infinanmany observers profess to find grounds for reassurance in the calm spirit in which the actual events has been re ceived. Securities have maintained a steady tone, both at New York and London, and the foreign exchanges have shown a quick recovery from ap-preliensions which developed at the close of the previous week.

In attempting to explain this steadiness, leading bankers point to a curious complex of factors. On this side of the Atlantic it is considered that our own industrial situation is strong enough to discourage bearish attacks on values, while a broad emphasis is lain on such influences as easy money and the reinvestment in foreign markets following the year-end. It also seems to be the case that profit making ability is returning on the other as well as on this side of the Atlantic. Any explanation of market firmness which did not take account of the philosophical attitude taken with regard to France's action would be, however, incomplete. In good quarters there is a feeling that it may be just as well to let France try out her policy and thus dispose of standing threat. Most bankers appear to agree with the British view that the occupation is economically and politically unwise, but they also take the


