Wilmington friends of D. L. Gallagher, former resident of this city, will be pleased to learn of his election as president of the Bank of Norlina.

The following is from the Warren Record: "The Bank of Warren, Warrenton and Norlina ceased to do business as a joint institution on Monday when a proposition, made by the Norlina branch some time ago, was accepted by the Warren parent bank.

The local bank will remain under the management of the same officials, and be operated as the Bank of Warrenton. The Norlina former branch is now conducted as the Bank of Norlina, without any connection with the local institution.

'Save a Life Day' Will be Observed in This City Sunday

Efforts Will be Made to Have Wilmingtonians Adopt Armenian Proteges

Sunday will be "Save a Life" day in Wilmington. Everyone who has the means is asked to save the life of an Armenian orphan by "adopting" it and paying \$5 a month for its support.

Rev. J. A. Sullivan, county chairman for the near east relief, is waging a campaign for the support of the 250 "wards" assigned to New Hanover county for support during the coming fiscal year.

Mr. Sullivan points out that unless funds for support of these 250 children are forthcoming they must be turned out of the North Carolina orphanage in the stricken Bible lands to starve on July 1. Overseas workers of the near east relief will have no other alternative.

HERREN ADDRESSES REAL ESTATE BOARD

National Secretary Discusses Problems Confronting Dealers on Country

William E. Herren, of Waterloo, Ia., secretary of the National Real Estate board, was the principal speaker before the meeting of the Wilmington board in the Y. W. C. A. cafeteria last night.

Mr. Herren arrived in the city late in the afternoon, and will go to Charleston this morning. Thomas H. Wright presided at the meeting last night, and introduced the speaker. Mr. Herren gave a very interesting talk on the real estate problems confronting the dealers of the country, and presented a strong plea for the multiplicity system, which is effective in many cities.

This is a plan whereby when a house or other property is listed with a dealer, he immediately files with the secretary of his local board, a full description of the property, together with the price required. The secretary then submits this description to each of the other dealers for the convenience of the buyer.

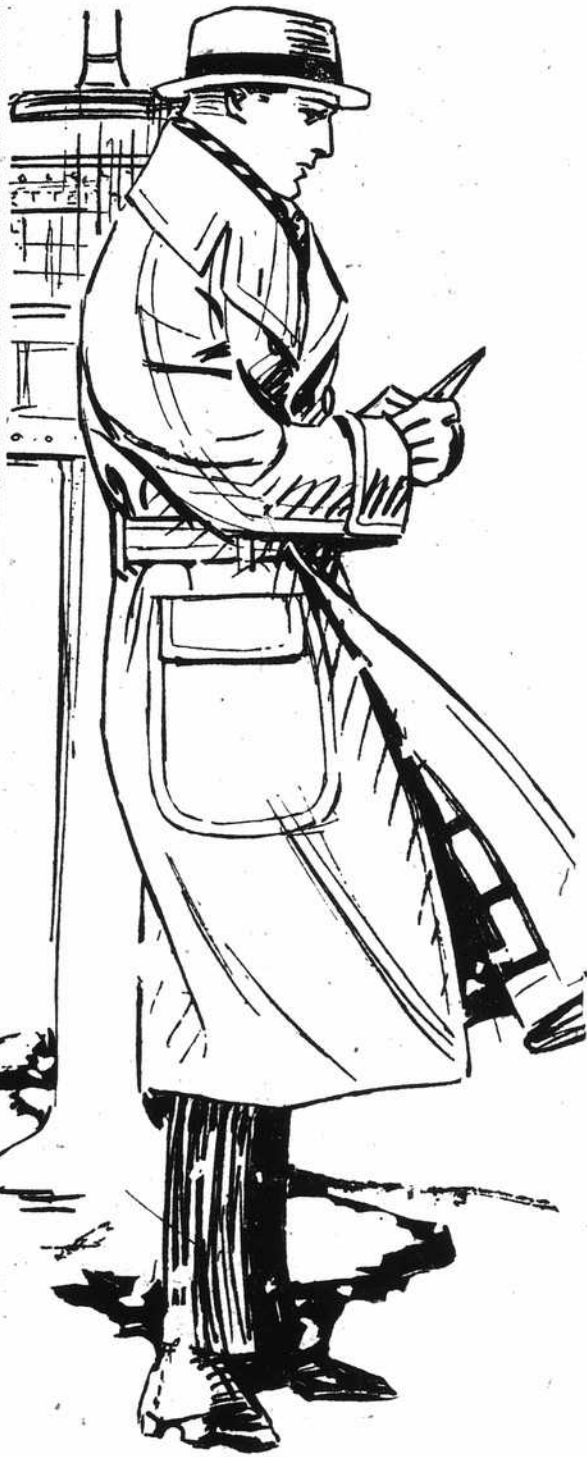
