

Casements are used through the building and are an essential factor in the excellent appearance of the building.

The sizes of the rooms are excellent. A fireplace in each living room is a feature that appeals to everyone, more especially since it is usually considered dispensable in a duplex or two-family house. French doors are attractive living room and dining room.
