## Behold, Mystery!



What was the most beautiful thing you ever saw? Maybe, it was the love light in a woman's eyes, a baby's smile or a sunrise.

Great artists agree that the most beautiful thing in nature is the aurora borealis—northern lights, so gorgeous in their coloring and so swiftly changing that no artist has ever been able to "catch them on canvas" except as a rather pathetic counterfeits.

In the above pen-picture by Artist Satterfield, you see a fur-clad traveler in the northern Yukon. He has stopped his dogs and is motionless on his sledges, filled with an infinite awe as he watches the aurora borealis. The light formation in the picture is known as the "Corona." In a twinkling it will change to "the dancers," "the searchlight," "the sheet" or "the rippling curtains."

The man on the sledge wonders what makes the northern lights. No scientist is certain. Some think it is electrical phenomena, others believe

is due to reflection of sunlight on polar ice.  
The scientist can not even fully define color, light or electricity, though they understand how these curious things operate and how they are conveyed to our minds. Nor can the scientists tell us the inner secret of the snow that surrounds the northern traveler. They say that snow is water crystallized at a certain low temperature. What is water? Oxygen and hydrogen, answer the scientists. They are silent when you ask, "What are hydrogen and oxygen?"  
"Man is an explorer, seeking final truth. His knowledge gets just so far, then runs into an impenetrable wall. We observe the processes by which millions of things happen, but can not see behind the veil.  
Education is the process of increasing our conception of our stupendous ignorance—of teaching us the infinite extent of what we do know and never can, this side of the grave.
