

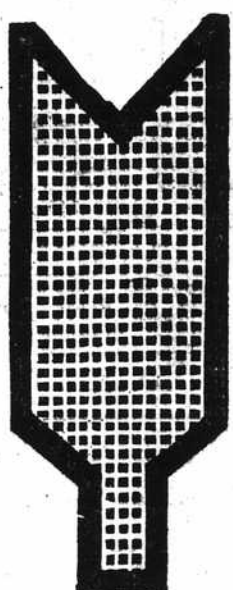
Most Popular Campaigner Will Be Winner
