Will Sail When Repairs Are Complete on Yamacraw

Senator F. M. Simmons has been informed by Rear Admiral W. E. Reynolds that it does not seem feasible to detain the coast guard cutter at Wilmington until the return to this station has been requested to do, and, therefore, the Seminole will depart from this port as soon as boiler repairs have been completed to the cutter Yamacraw, of the Savannah station.

Just as soon as the boilers and machinery of the Yamacraw have been repaired the Seminole will proceed to Detroit, Mich., where she is to be stationed in the future.


