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GOVERNMENT COTTON REPORTS

It will be of general interest to recite the record of the Department of Agriculture in estimating the cotton crop from its July condition report, and the record is concisely stated as follows: July 1922, estimate 11,065,000 bales, actual crop 9,761,817 or an over estimate of 1,304,000 bales.

June is generally accounted the month of improvement in cotton, and the average July condition for the past ten years is 76 as against 69.9 for July this year.

CROP REVIEW. WASHINGTON, July 29.—The department of agriculture weather and crop review regarding cotton follows: Generally cool weather prevailed throughout the cotton belt, except that the weekly mean temperatures were above normal in the southwestern portion and along the immediate Atlantic coast.
