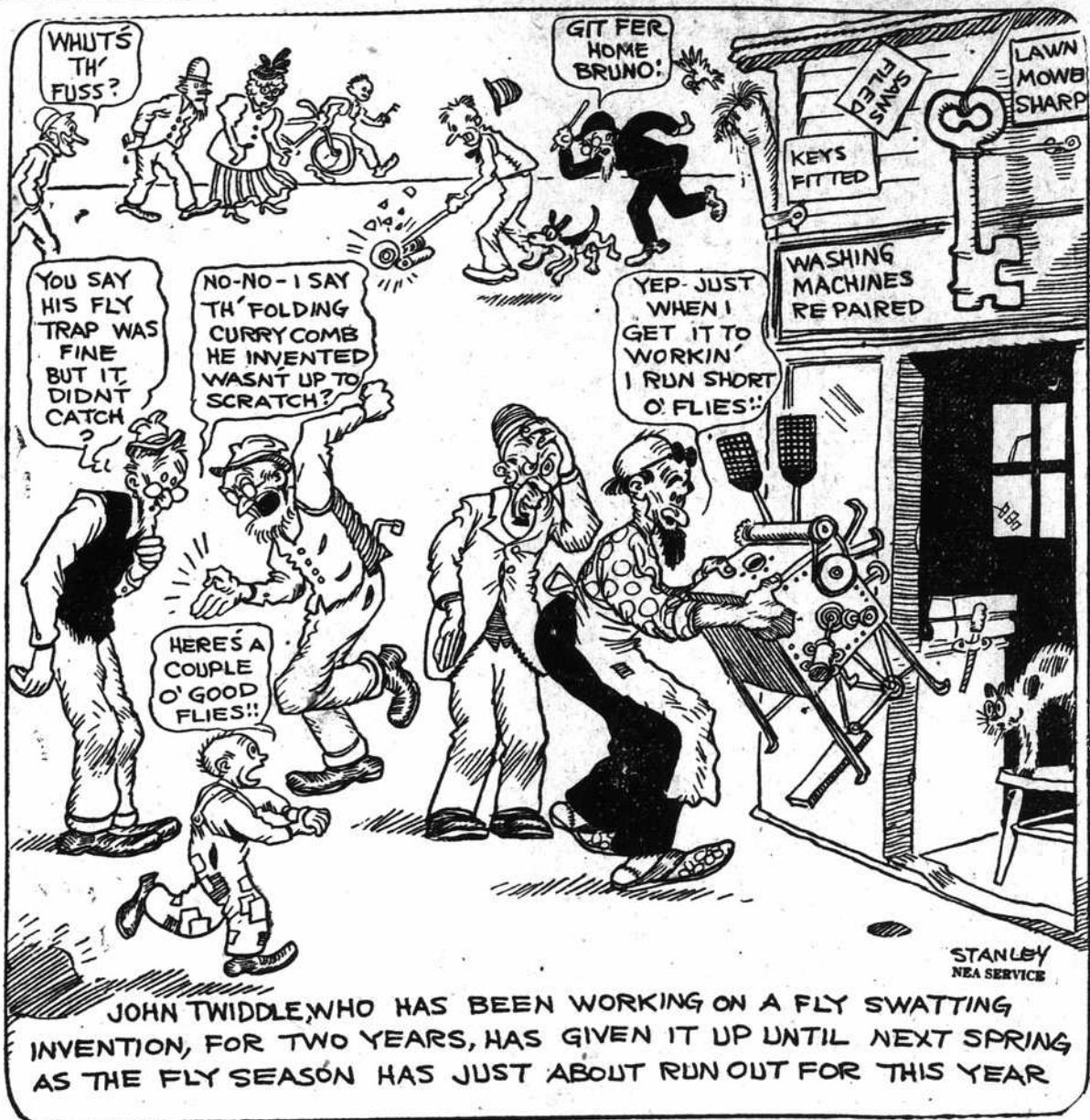

### MITCHELL IS GIVEN HIS FREEDOM AFTER EVIDENCE IS HEARD

Dan Mitchell, negro, shot and fatally wounded Rufus Freeman, another negro in a brawl at Mitchell's home in the Carolina Beach section Monday, but the coroner's jury Thursday morning declared that the killing was justifiable homicide and Sheriff George C. Jackson accordingly gave Mitchell

his freedom. Freeman was brought to the James Walker Memorial hospital treatment immediately after he was wounded, but died Wednesday afternoon. Mitchell, until given his freedom by the jury, was held without bond. He was met by Sheriff Jackson on Monday afternoon en route to the city to give himself up following the shooting of Freeman.

After hearing all witnesses in the case Thursday morning, the coroner's jury returned the following verdict: "That Rufus Freeman came to his death as a result of a bullet piercing his heart, the same being fired by Dan Mitchell in defense of his person and home; and in our opinion this is a case of justifiable homicide."

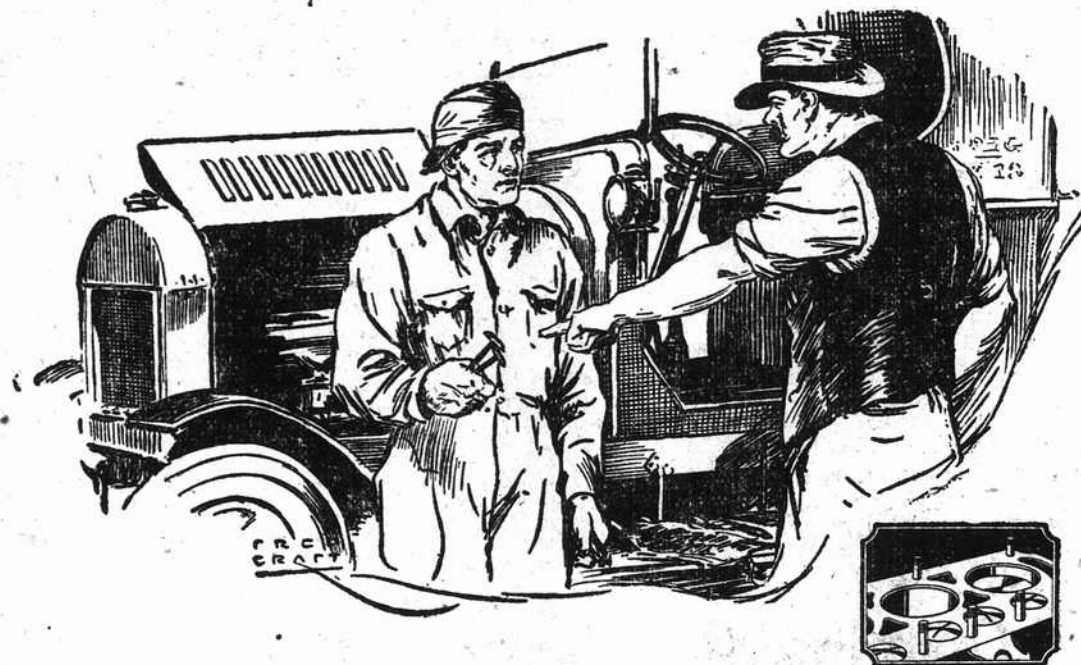
