An offer of military aid reportedly has been made also to Hungary and Bulgaria by the Allies.

However, these two countries are said to have been reluctant to accept promises which might compromise their neutrality in German or Italian eyes.

In recent weeks both Yugoslavia and Bulgaria, Slavic nations, have been showing an inclination to lean toward the hig Slav nation, Russia, for support, rather than to the

western powers. The belief was expressed in quarters close to the Yugoslav government that a Yugoslav-Soviet military alliance might result from the military mission's journey to Moscow. Only yesterday it was reported that economic negotiations between Yugoslavia and
