## W. T. BRYAN, 62, IS FOUND DEAD

Former Mayor Of Jacksonville Also Served On Onslow School Committee

JACKSONVILLE, Oct. 19-W. T. Bryan, 62, former mayor of Jacksonville, was found dead in a rear office of the Bryan building in the downtown section here about 12:30 o'clock this afternoon.

Mr. Bryan, a former member of the Onslow county board of commissioners and onetime member of the local school committee, had been in poor health, investigating officers said. They quoted persons in a nearby building as saying they heard a loud report, as of a pistcl firing, about 11 o'clock this morning. The bullet took effect in the left side of the chest.

Funeral services will be held at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the late residence, with the Rev. J. R. Phipps officiating. Burial will follow in the Jacksonville


The newspaper's statement said it favored President Roosevelt in 1932 and 1936 and outlined reasons for supporting him now.
