Scores One Touchdown, Sets Up Another, Then Snags Man To Save Game

RALEIGH, Oct. 19-(AP)-Sweet Jim Lalanne scored one touchdown, set up another and then saved the ball game for his North Carolina mates by coming out of nowhere and nailing a runner from behind, as the Tar Heels defeated N. C. State 13-7, in an action packed southern conference game here today before 15,000.

State took an early lead, scoring five minutes after the opening kickoff. The touchdown was set up after a State punt bounced off the leg of Don Baker, and was covered on North Carolina's 21 by Ralph Burt, State guard. Pat Fehley gained 11 and a pass from Dick Watts to Jack Hurkabee was good in the end zone. Fehley kicked the placement.

Lalanne evened the count with 10 seconds left in the first quarter. Plunging over left guard from the two-yard stripe, Harry Dunkle converted from placement.
