as many tactical planes - bombers, pursuit ships and certain observation craft—as the Army did during November, it was said. Actual numbers were not disclosed, on the ground that this was valuable military information.

Aside from the administration's policy of all aid "short of war," one of the reasons the British received such a preponderance of America's warplane production was the Army's action in exchanging current produc-

tion for later model ships. Last spring, for instance, the Army agreed to let the British buy some of the Curtiss P-40 pursuit ships it ad ordered. The Army's original order, greatly reduced, was filled by the last of October. Thus virtually all production of P-40's is now going to the British.

At the time it reduced its own order of this type plane, however, the Army placed orders with the Curtiss-Wright company for great numbers of modern ships embodying lessons learned in the European war. Deliveries of one type of these are scheduled to start in February, of another in April.


