A sharp de cline was recorded, however, in the collection of delinquent taxes for the first nine months of the present year as compared with the likeperiod of the previous financial year, \$79,380.09 being received this year against \$118,969.98 of the 1939-40 year. Revenue from the county Alcohol Beverage Control board was approximately \$1,200 above the previous year's total of \$2,112.72.

Other communicable diseases reported were: chickenpox, 47; whooping cough, 29; syphilis, 28; measles, 20; gonorrhea, 10; tuberculosis, 6; diphtheria, 3; scarlet fever, meningitis, and chancroid, one each.
