SOLON PROPOSES RADIO OVERHAUL

Legislation Would Compel Stations to Give Equal Time in Debate

WASHINGTON, July 31.— (P) — Senator White (R-Me) introduced today legislation to overhaul the present Federal Communications act. Among other things ,the measure would require a radio station owner "to afford a right of reply where public officers, other than the President, use his station for the discussion of public or political questions."

"This right of reply is to be exercised by the accredited representatives of the opposition political party or parties," a statement by White said, "and is to be afforded upon the same terms and conditions as the original discussion.' Another provision of the new

legislation would require all radio speakers on political questionswhether local, state or nationalto be identified.

White said other provisions of the measure were "designed to curb an alleged tendency on the part of the Federal Communica. tions commission to discriminate in a manner not authorized by the statute between applicants for broadcast and other radio facili-

"An administrative tribunal. is not . . . authorized or permitted to set itself up as a general legis. lative body making its own rules of conduct and decision wholly apart from and beyond the language of the statute.
