METHODISTS ASK BAN ON LIQUORS

Conerence Would Stop Sale Near Fort Bragg And Other Army Posts

DURHAM, Nov. 13.—(AP)—The North Carolina Methodist conference today urged governmental agencies "to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in the counties and districts surrounding Fort Bragg and other military camps where our boys are being trained in our national defense program."

The temperance board report asked "friends of temperance" to nominate and elect legislators who will outlaw alcoholic beverages, and "nominate and elect sheriffs, judges and other law enforcement officers who will enforce the laws against liquor."

The five-day conference will end tomorrow after Bishop Clare Purcell reads his list of appointments, under which more than 300 ministers of the conference will be assigned to pastorates for the coming year.

The conference voted today to hold the 1942 meeting at St. Paul's church in Goldsboro.

The conference acted to increase revenues of the Methodist orphanage at Raleigh which takes care of some 300 children. A levy on churches of six per cent of what they raised last year was approved—exclusive of sums raised for buildings and to pay debts.

The orphanage has been operating at a deficit under the old system by which it got 10 per cent of pastors' salaries and the proceeds of special collections. A delegate estimated the 6 per cent levy would raise \$71,000 as compared with \$55,803 raised last year.

BAPTISTS HEAR CAPT. NEWMAN

Noted Educator Stresses Public Schools' Role In U. S. Democracy

Capt. James R. Newman, secretary of the Camp Davis Barrage Balloon school, give an address entitled, "The Role of the Public School in National Defense," before members of the Baptist church Thursday evening.

He recently gave the same talk at the annual meeting of the New York State School Board association in Syracuse. The speech, which was well received, emphasized the duty of the American public school system in the preservation of democracy. In his address, he issued a sharp warning that the next few years would be an "all out" fight, not to save England, but "to preserve for tomorrow's children the blessings of liberty."

He further stated "if we are to defend our American way of life, we must arm ourselves with facts, as well as with guns. The best thing the schools can do for national defense now is to teach children that the coveting of that possessed by others has always been the motivating force behind the rise and development of every great nation of people."

Next week, Captain Newman will give the same address in New York before the 16th District of the Long Island Parent-Teacher association. Before entering the Army, Captain Newman was well-known in educational circles, being supervising principal of the 16th District Public schools of New York state.
