Army Plans To Acquire Planes From Civilians

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11. (AP) - The Army and Navy announced jointly today that they were taking steps to acquire approximately 300 aircraft from civilian owners for military and naval use.
"The purchase of civilian aircraft will proceed on the basis of selection of planes wanted, rather than on the basis of those offered for sale, and individual owners of planes wanted will be advised by appropriate government agencies," a terse announcement said.
Some owners have approached the War and Navy departments with offers to sell their planes, and some have been offered as gifts. The War department explained, however, that many proffered planes were unsuited for uses for which civilian craft are needed.

Pan American Union Sponsors Essay Test

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11. (AP) - The Pan American Union announced today an essay contest open to high school pupils in the 21 American republics, with two four-year university scholarships as the prizes.
The topic is "what inter-American cooperation means to my country" and the two scholarships, each valued at \$8,000, are offered for the best papers submitted after study and discussion. One prize is for the best paper in English, the other for the best presentation in Spanish, Portuguese or French.
The announcement was made by Dr. L. S. Rowe, director general of the union on the eve of his departure for Rio de Janeiro to attend the meeting of foreign ministers beginning there on Jan. 15.

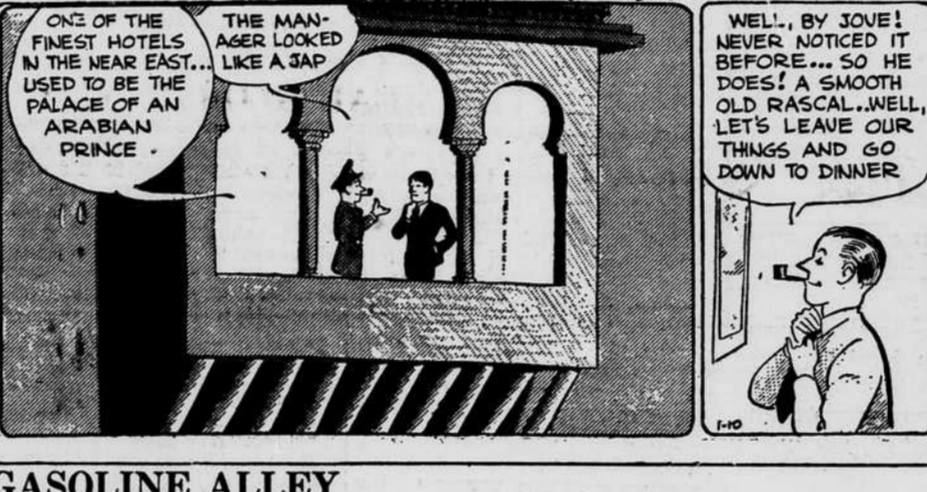

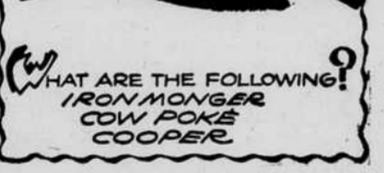
