3 RALEIGH PEOPLE KILLED IN WRECK

Automobile Reported To Have Crashed Into Truck Near Walterboro, S. C.

WALTERBORO S. C., April 2. (AP)—Three residents of Raleigh, N. C., were killed and a fourth was seriously injured near here late last night in an automobile-truck collision.
Deputy Sheriff J. J. Trowell of Colleton county said that Miss Margaret Cawthorne and her sister, Mrs. J. A. Carter were instantly killed and J. M. Gaddis died approximately four hours later at a hospital here. Mrs. Carter's husband, the only other occupant of the automobile, was reported in a serious condition at the hospital.
Trowell said the accident occurred seven miles south of Walterboro on U. S. Highway 17. Both vehicles were headed north, he said. Trowell gave the name of the truck driver as Sebrun Kendrick of Linton, Ga. The truck was parked awaiting repairs when the automobile ran into the rear of the truck, he said.

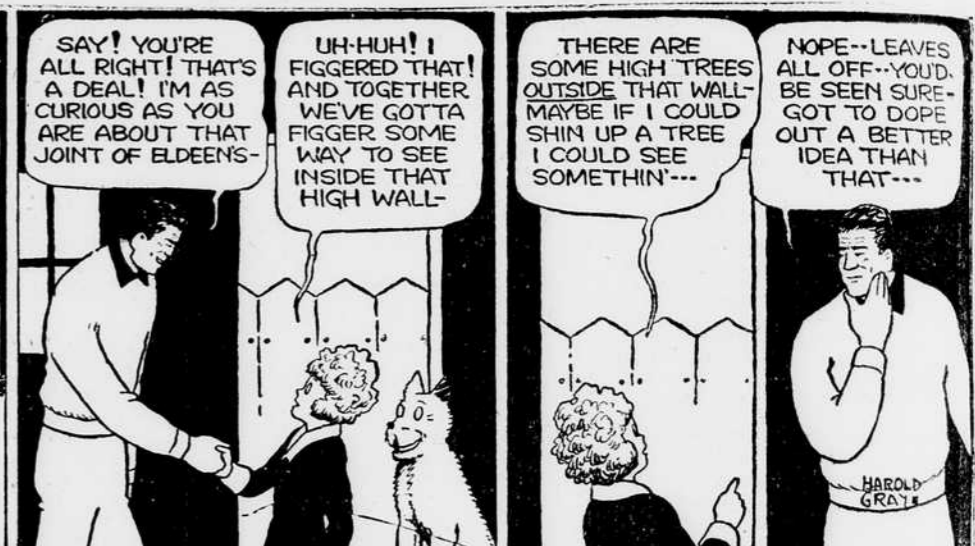
German Bombers Raid South Wales Section

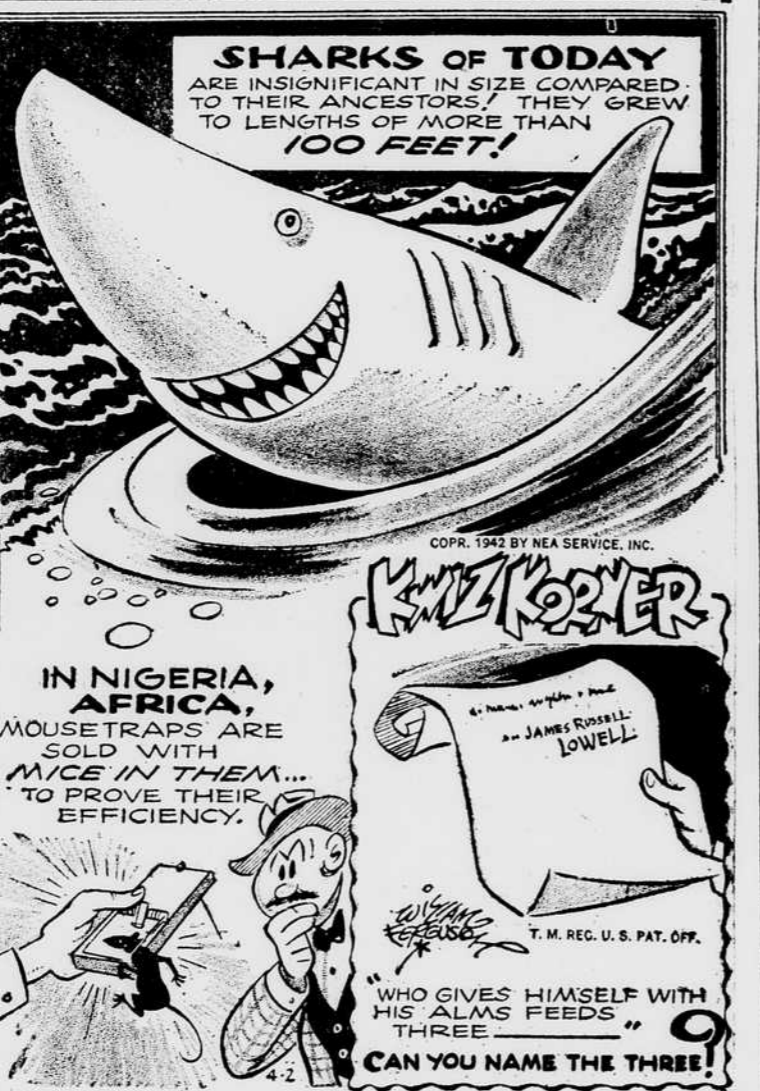


DUTCH HARASSING JAPS IN INDIES

Fight Goes On Despite Fall Of Java And Severe Losses Sustained

WASHINGTON April 2. (AP)—Netherlands Indies forces were reported here today to be still giving blows to the Japanese invaders nearly four weeks after the loss of Java.
Authorized sources said isolated detachments were known to be fighting the toe in Java, Borneo, Sumatra and Celebes, and possibly other islands.
Netherlands fliers and planes which escaped the foe in Java in early March were said to be operating with American and Australian air forces, hammering at Japanese air bases in New Guinea and elsewhere near the northern perimeter of the continent.
Some ground forces likewise were believed to have been transferred from Java to reinforce Australian defenders.
Netherlands Naval units which escaped the disastrous battle of the Java sea and other sea fighting were shifted to the Indian ocean, to serve under British Naval command.
Severed communications make it impossible to assess the effectiveness of the resistance put up by relatively small Dutch forces in the principal Indies islands. Military authorities believe it is of the same general nature as the persistent raids carried out in the Philippines by forces operating in Mindanao and other islands separated from the main Bataan peninsula fighting front on Luzon.

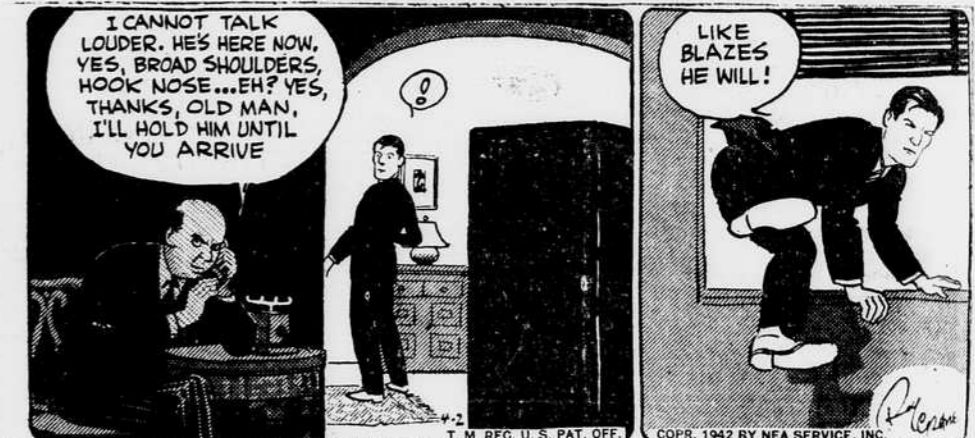

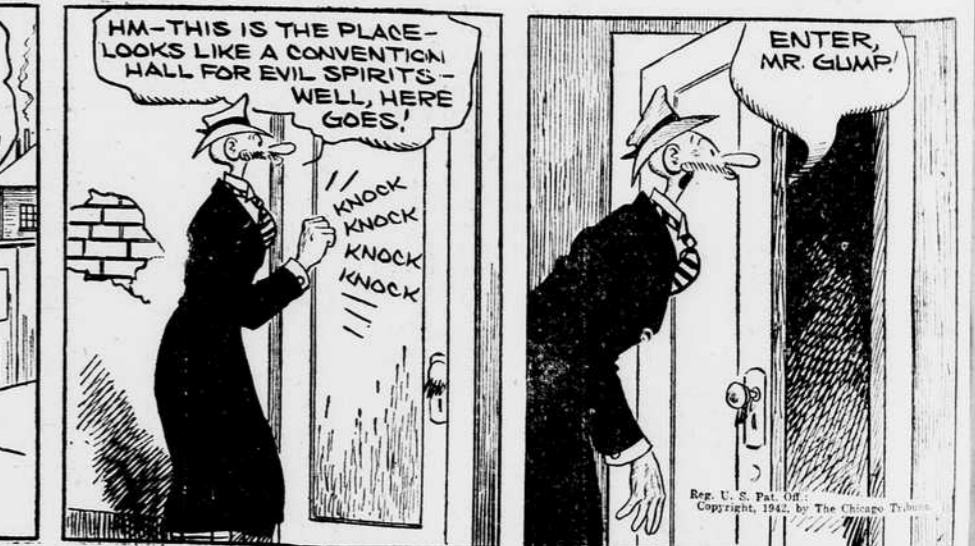
