

STATE WILL OPEN EXERCISES FRIDAY

RALEIGH, May 2.—(P)—N. C. State college will hold its war-affected graduation exercises here next Friday and Saturday—a full month earlier than in normal years.

In the senior class are 336 candidates for degrees, 29 of which are to receive advanced degrees.

The exercises were advanced a month because of the war-inspired need for technically trained students. A month after the last sheepskin is awarded the school will go on a quarter basis under which a student may get a degree in three years.

The military theme will be evident throughout the ceremonies. More than 100 of the men graduates will receive commissions in the officers reserve corps and will go on immediate active duty. Scores of others have indicated they will enter the naval reserve for shore construction work.

Classes In Religious Study To Begin Monday

In connection with a city wide training union program, the Baptist Training union of Temple Baptist church will start a study course Monday night at 7:30 o'clock.

The program will consist of two classes and a recreation period. The first portion of the meeting will extend from 7:30 o'clock until 8:15 o'clock. A fifteen minute rest period will break the two classes and the final session will start at 8:30 o'clock running until 9:15 o'clock.

There will be classes for all age groups. The adults will study from the book, "The Fine Art of Soul Winning," taught by the Rev. James Butler. The young people will be led by the pastor of the church, the Rev. J. Roy Clifford, in study from "Fields of Service in the Church." Mrs. J. R. Clifford will teach the intermediate group in "Witnessing for Christ" and the Junior union will be instructed by J. O. Greene from the book "Living for Christ."

Members of the various unions are urged to attend these classes and the public is cordially invited to attend. The classes will commence promptly at 7:30 o'clock each night and will run from Monday through Friday night.

Italy Plans To Force Investment Of Excess Profits In New Bonds

BERN, Switzerland, May 2.—(P)—Premier Mussolini, back from Salzburg where he met Hitler in a conference which Il Duce termed a "vast exchange of views on military and political problems," ordered his council of ministers in Rome today to approve a decree compelling the investment of excess profits in special treasury bonds.

The council approved other decrees increasing pensions of survivors of war dead 40 to 50 per cent.

The Salzburg meeting of the Axis chiefs, their foreign ministers and warlords was hailed by the Italian press as a curtain raiser for important actions.

SUGAR REGISTRATION WILL START MONDAY

The schools, said Saturday. In addition, mimeographed forms explaining the registration have been distributed to homes in the county through school children.

All elementary schools in the county will close at 1:15 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in order to carry on the sugar registration. The High schools, however, will continue their regular schedule.

"Don't put off registering for your War ration books until the last day," O. H. Shoemaker, chairman of the county rationing board urged.

"By registering early, you will be able to begin purchasing sugar Tuesday morning and you will avoid working a hardship on the registrars who are serving purely on a voluntary basis without pay."

Persons here may register at any one of the 12 white and 11 negro elementary schools in the county, regardless of the location of their residence.

One incidental effect of the registration will be to provide an accurate index to the population of the county, variously estimated to have been increased by from 35,000 to 40,000 persons since the 1940 census. The registration will

be held at the following white elementary schools: Cornelius Harnett, Hemenway, Tileston, William H. Cooper, Washington Callett, Isaac Beasly, Sunset Park, Wrightsboro, Forest Hills, Winter Park, Bradley Creek and Carolina Beach.

And the following negro elementary schools: Peabody, Williston Primary, Castle Hayne, Wrightsboro, Acorn Branch, Kirkland, Middle Sound, East Wilmington, Wrightsville, Masonboro and Oak Hill.

FIRST TASTE

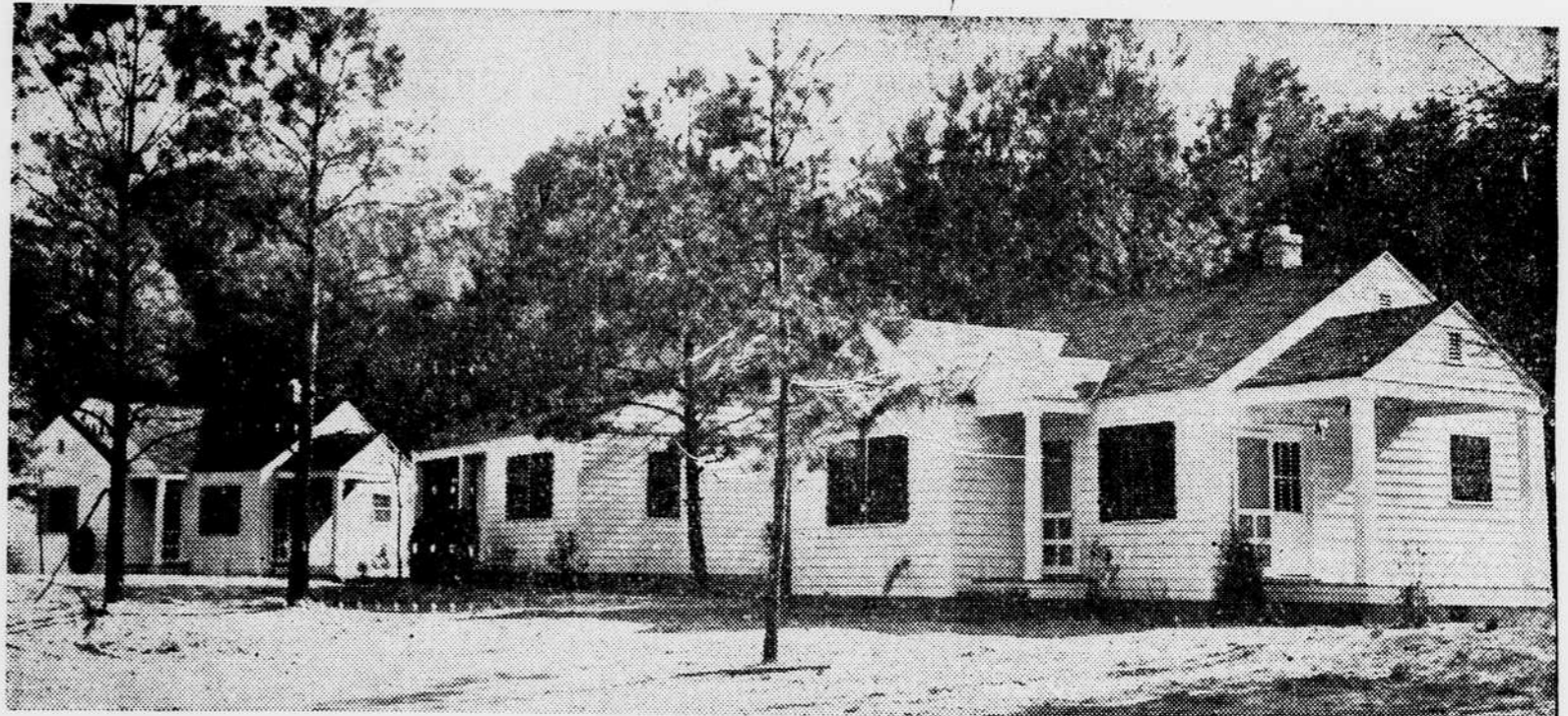
