"Responsible Christian workers from several denominations are taking an active interest in the campaign, and we expect many others to join with us this week in all-out, all-Christian effort for revival."

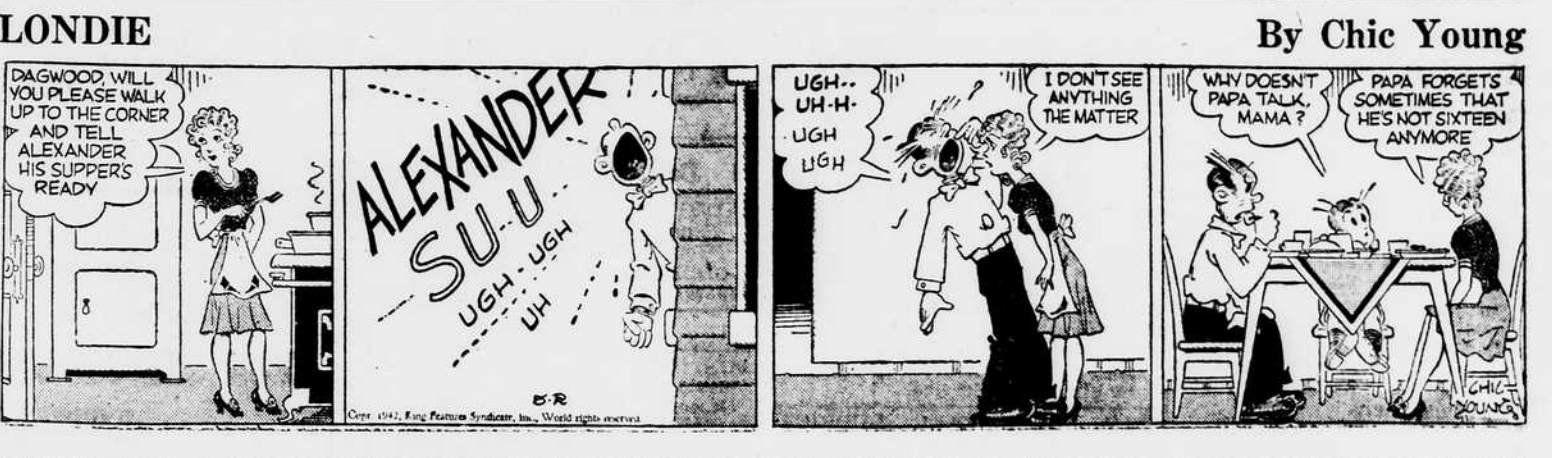
CLOCKS ADVANCED
