"If a baseball strikes concrete it usually is rendered unusable," Gardner said, "but a ball that is caught or does not strike metál or concrete can be used again.

"I would like to urge the fans to take the balls they get in the stands to the club boxoffices and obtain passes to future games for them instead of taking them home. If there is an opportunity to catch a ball before it strikes the stands or seats, so much the better."

Gardner said the situation in the Texas league undoubtedly would be general.
