BAILEY HOLDS LARGE LEAD; JONES, SMITH, KERMON AND HENDERSON WIN IN COUNTY

136 POLLS REPORT Present Senator Receives 18,183 Votes Against 6,194 For Opponent LITTLE INTEREST Incumbent Congressmen Faring Well In Hands Of State's Voters

RALEIGH, May 30.—(AP)—Senator Josiah W. Bailey, seeking a third term, piled up a commanding lead over his only opponent, Richard T. Fountain, as returns were tabulated from today's democratic primary.

Public Indifferent Reports from throughout the state indicate that the public indifference displayed during the campaign continued on voting day.

First returns showed an almost negligible vote in the only statewide republican primary. Stoner R. Klutz of Salisbury had 66 votes against 57 for Sam J. Morris of Raleigh, in the contest for the senatorial nomination.

Rep. Herbert Bonner took a substantial lead over two opponents in the First district. Reports from
