## Cologne 'Forever Lost', Says Nazi Newspapers

BERN, Switzerland, June 5.—The first Cologne newspaper since the monster RAF raid of last Saturday night reached neutral territory today, carrying the somber statement that the historic Rhineland city, as its name has known it, is "forever lost."

The Koelnische Zeitung, resumption publication on Wednesday of this week, describes Cologne as "still smoking ruins," with some fires still alight and "whole quarters of the town empty."

(A German dispatch quoted by the Stockholm newspaper Dagens Nyheter said all the property of 10,000 persons had been destroyed; that the central district of the city was ruined and that the damage had reached deep into the suburbs.)

Said the Koelnische Zeitung: "The entire aspect of the city is completely changed. Tens of thousands of inhabitants during that night learned with horror that the individual is powerless against fate."

The newspaper avoided saying whether the vast and magnificent Gothic cathedral, famous the world over, had been hit, but it did say that "most of the precious monuments which have held a chief place in German art were more or less destroyed by fire and irreparable. It went on:

"Those who survived the night of May 30 and who on the morrow looked at the city were fully aware that they had bade farewell forever to their Cologne because the damage is enormous and because the integral part of the character and even the traditions of the city is gone forever."

"Everywhere the same spectacle—indescribable destruction. Only shattered windows and walls are seen.

"Around the church of St. Martin and the church of St. Maria Im Capitol the ruins still are smoking."

"The gross St. Martin is a Romanesque church with a foundation attributed to the 10th century. It's situated a few hundred yards from the cathedral St. Maria Im Capitol, a Romanesque basilica of the 11th-13th centuries, is nearby.)

A Berlin dispatch to the Zurich newspaper Neue Zuercher Zeitung quoted the following statement to the people of Cologne from the local Gauleiter:

"Apart from the heavy damage which the city has endured . . . There is hardly any one among us who has not been affected personally by the consequences of this night. We still shall need much patience and a long time to overcome the worst effects of this attack."

(German broadcasts Friday quoted a Hague dispatch as saying several thousand children from the German Rhineland would arrive in the Netherlands shortly to spend the summer with Dutch families. Four hundred already are said to have reached Holland. This was described as an "exchange" of children between Germany and Holland which has been taking place for many years.)

**120,000,000 POUNDS OF BEEF** Americans in 1941 consumed more than 120,000,000 pounds of beef made extra tender with the aid of invisible ultraviolet rays. The germ-killing lamps enable packers to use higher temperature and humidity to speed up tenderization without danger of bacteria and mold growth which would ordinarily spoil the meat.

**BE AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$600,000.00 WATER WORKS** BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON: Section 1. That the City of Wilmington issue its bonds, pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, as amended, in an amount not exceeding \$600,000.00 for the purpose of paying all or a part of the cost of constructing extensions to the existing water works system of said City, including the acquisition of a new source of supply. Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 3. That a statement of the debt of the City has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection. Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of the City at an election as provided by law. The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 27th day of May, 1942, and was first published on the 30 day of May, 1942. Any action of proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication. J. R. BENSON, City Clerk
