#### Half Of 800 Demountable Units Contracted To Georgia Firm

Go-ahead signal on construction of half the 800 prefabricated, demountable shipyard worker homes to be built here, was given the Harden and Ramsey company of Atlanta, yesterday. The Georgia firm was successful bidder on the first 400 units to be made.

Negotiations are under way with the Green Lumber company of Laurel, Mass., for construction of the second 400, according to Executive Director Henry R. Emory of the Wilmington Housing authority. However, he said, the WPB has not authorized release of the lumber to be used on the pro-

At the same time, U. S. District Attorney J. O. Carr revealed that proceedings to condemn the 123.31 acres of land near the southern end of the yards of the North Carolina Shipbuilding company, on which the homes will be erected, were filed yesterday.

A declaration of taking, which will place the government in ownership of the property, has been forwarded to Federal Judge Isaac M. Meekins in Elizabeth City and is expected to be returned here tomorrow to be filed with the clerk of the district court.

A check for \$15,609.56 has been deposited by the government to cover the cost of the land, which involves approximately 50 parcels. Mr. Carr said.

Guion company of Charlotte, to whom the contract for site improvements for the project was awarded by the housing authority here last week, arrived here Monday to begin work on leveling off the project site, laying out streets. installing electric and sewer facilities, and constructing a community building for the project.

#### **NATIONS AT WAR** Two North Carolinians RESPECT RADIO

Chairman Tells Congress Of Mutual Agreement In Countries On 'Jamming'

WASHINGTON, June 11.- (P) -Warring nations mutually refrain from the promiscuous "jamming" of opposition radio broadcasts, Chairman James L. Fly of the Federal Communications Commission testified today at a Congressional hearing.

Appearing in connection with proposed changes in the Communications Act, Fly told the House Interstate Commerce Committee that the FCC was monitoring (Listening in on) virtually every broadcast emanating from enemy countries and was making the information obtained available to war

In reply to questions by committee, Fly said most of the foreign propaganda broadcasts were sent by short wave and could be rendered ineffective by "jamming" hem, creating air interference to nake them difficult to be heard. However, he added, "jamming"

s rarely resorted to because of mutual, if unspoken, understanding among the nations not to interfere with the broadcasting activities of the others and lead to a situation whereby all broadcasts might be made impotent.

The FCC head did not definitely state that the world's powers had reached a binding agreement on this matter, and committee members did not press him for a more complete explanation of the nature of the mutual understanding. As part of its program of polic-


