DEFENSE SCHOOL SLATED JUNE 25

Southeastern N. C. Officers Are Invited To Attend Gathering Here

Southeastern North Carolina law enforcement officers have been invited to attend a one-day national defense school at the USO club at Second and Orange streets here on June 25.

Edward Scheidt, agent in charge of the Charlotte office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, announced Saturday.

Sponsored by the FBI, the meeting here will include discussions of problems relating to espionage and sabotage; training of police and police auxiliaries for duties under air raid conditions, and ways in which law enforcement officers can cooperate with local civilian protection organizations.

The meeting here, one of six over the state, will convene at 10:30 a.m. and last until 4 p.m.

Speakers on the program will include Agent Scheidt, Chief of Police Walter Anderson of Winston-Salem, and Director Albert Cones of the Institute of Government at Chapel Hill.
