ADDITIONAL NIGHT CLASSES PLANNED

Two Scheduled To Get Under Way Monday Night At The High School

The current demand for all types of office workers is exceeding the supply to such an extent that two new night classes will begin Monday at New Hanover High school in connection with the summer commercial classes now in progress. It will bring the total number of classes to 13.

Bookkeeping will be taught in room No. 112 and typewriting and office machines in room No. 116 from 7:15 to 9:15 o'clock. The evening class in bookkeeping is designed to give an understanding of fundamental principles of business methods, budgets, bookkeeping and an interpretation of records.

The instruction in the evening typing class will give a thorough review in the mastery of the keyboard, machine parts, changing of ribbons, and care of machines, a review of standard letter forms, tabulation and rough draft. Emphasis will also be placed on speed building.

It is suggested that working persons who feel the need of broadening their present qualifications and improving their earning capacity avail themselves of the commercial courses.

250 Local High School Students Complete Elective Bible Course

Wilmington's third successful year of Bible study in the public schools has ended with approximately 250 High school students completing the elective Bible course.

Thirteen denominations and forty churches were represented in the group taught by Miss Esther Banks and Miss Maude M. Webber. There were seven daily classes held for students beginning the Bible course, and one advanced Bible class met daily.

The High school Bible club was unusually active this year. Services were held at the County Home, Red Cross Sanitarium and the Catherine Kennedy Home. Both white and colored grammar schools in the county had two weeks of character education Bible study under the instruction of Miss Webber.

A number of the grammar schools organized Character clubs which emphasized the development of high ideals in the lives of the students.

Responding to a persistent appeal, a Bible class for adults met each Monday night at the High school under the leadership of Miss Webber. About 135 attended the weekly class, representing five denominations and 20 churches.

The Bible club of Wilmington (S.O.L., Serve Others Loyally) with a membership of 65 is made up of students interested in Christian service. It is a branch of the

S.O.L. Bible club in this state. Other units of the club are the Central High school, Charlotte, and Asheville High schools.

The Moral Committee of the Bible club formulated the following pledge for the support of candidates for student offices of the High school.

I will support only those candidates who show Christian leadership in our school and in outside activities. I will support any candidate who will do all in his power to vanish the following evils from our school: cheating in the classroom; swearing in or near the High school; gambling in any form; stealing in the school; furnishing alcoholic beverages to students; frequenting poolrooms or other places of cheap environment; improper conduct of boy and girl relationship.

In choosing our school leaders for the coming year I will be guided by the following passage of scripture: "And He spake a parable unto them, can the blind lead the blind? shall they both not fall into the ditch?"

CITY GOVERNMENT

The form of your city government can be changed in two ways: (1) by a vote of the people (2) by legislative decree without a popular vote.

In 1941, the Citizens of Wilmington, by a majority vote in a legally called election, adopted the Council-Manager Plan of government in place of the Commission form.

Many citizens are interested in learning the attitude of the senatorial candidates toward these two forms of government.

My position is that a majority of the PEOPLE and not one individual should determine the form of government they should have. Any change in that government should result only from an election duly called and not solely from an act of the legislature without a vote of the people. Should a substantial number of citizens petition to vote again on the question, they should be permitted to do so, and I would support legislation to that end.

The voters are entitled to know the position of the other senatorial candidate on this important question.

Enforcement of May Act Held Unnecessary Here

Inclusion of Wilmington and vicinity in the North Carolina areas where Federal authorities are invoking the May act to curb prostitution and the spread of venereal disease among the nation's armed forces is not expected at present.

Commenting on the announcement the post commanders at Fort Bragg and Camp Butler were calling for the enforcement of the May act, in conjunction with local law enforcement, to stamp out vice in areas visited by men from the two posts, Maj.-Gen. Frederic H. Smith, commanding officer of Camp Davis, said this morning he knew of no reason to put the federal act into effect here at this time.

"Invocation of the May act can be taken to mean that local law enforcement officers are falling down on their jobs," he said. "As yet, I see no reason why the act should be put into effect here."

Governor Broughton yesterday announced that there was a possibility that the May act, which provides a \$1,000 fine for civilian violators or one year's imprisonment or both, and court martial for military personnel, might be enforced on a state-wide basis to control the influx of women expected to materialize with the beginning of the fall maneuvers in the state.

However, the act would not be put into effect unless the various post commanders request that it be done.

On September 25, 1941, there was formed a Vice or Anti-Prostitution Squad — consisting of officers from Camp Davis, the Sheriff's Office, and the Wilmington Police Department to combat the evil that we all knew would come.

We are striving to keep our men in the armed forces physically fit to carry on against the forces of destruction that call themselves the Axis Powers.

Through the combined efforts of both civil and military law enforcement agencies 154 CASES of prostitution have been PROSECUTED BY YOUR DISTRICT SOLICITOR in the Superior Court of New Hanover County and in each instance a verdict of guilty has been obtained by your District Solicitor.

Thank you, General Smith and Major Cooley, for your confidence and appreciation of our efforts. We will continue to "carry on" with you.
