



While the Germans moved through the waist-high fields of ripening grain and the minerally rich Don basin, the stout Russian forces at the northern extremity of the 220 mile Don front struch savagely against the weakened Germans and Hungarians who have tried vainly for two weeks to capture Voronezh on the upper Don. The Russians officially claimed the initiative there, and dispatches said they had wrested five popnlated places and driven many of the foe back across the sluggish water, inflicting enormous casual
