## Many Hurry To Purchase Non Rationed Footwear Apparel

If they can help it, Wilmington-ians will not suffer from shoe rationing this summer for they are rushing to buy non - rationed "play" shoes, as well as having all of last summer's footwear repaired.

Since the advent of shoe rationing, shoe repair shops here have had their business increase twofold. And with the change of sea-son, more and more shoes are being carried to the shops for repair. So heavy are the demands, that most shops will not guarantee delivery in less than a week, and delays are oftentimes much

It is expected that "play" shoes or the soft-soled canvas and other material sandals, will be seen more in Wilmington this year than ever before.

Because of the light weight of these shoes, they are not suitable to wear in most cases just yet but local women do not intend to be "caught without footwear," sales at Wilmington shoe stores indicate.

### Night Shift Of Steel **Company Reports For** Work After Disputes

PITTSBURGH April 7 .--- (AP)-The night shift at the big Edgar Thom-son plant of the Carnegie-Illinois steel corporation reported for work tonight after a dispute over installation of time clocks had caused the day shift to remain idle.

The men returned on the basis of an agreement between the management and the union's grivance committee that a joint study of representatives of both sides be started immediately to determine "the fairness of the newly created job of acaccounting mill clerk" to which former time takers were assigned, company statement said.

Sixten time takers had been shifted to the new posts at a lower rate of pay. The company estimated the work

stoppage resulted in a production loss of 2,200 tons of steel ingots, 1,700 tons of Bessemer steel and 2,000 tons of pig iron.


