NEW YORK, June 13.—(AP)—Rising optimism over prospects for early termination of the war in Europe expressed itself today in another buying spurge in the stock exchange.

Advances were broadly distributed and ran from fractions to more than 2 points. A fair number of industrial stocks reached the highest levels since late 1939, or before the start of the war. For the second time this year volume exceeded 2,000,000 shares.

At the close some prices were a little under the day's highs but generally the final quotations were near the best. Motors, rubbers, steels, farm equipments, chemicals, amusements and merchandising and soft drink issues were especially popular with buyers.

Low priced motors and specialties were traded in large blocks but their action was uneven in contrast with yesterday's strength.

Bonds improved under broad buying of rail issues. Chicago wheat advanced 1 to 2 cents a bushel and rye climbed 1 3/4 to 2 1/2. Hogs were steady to 15 cents lower.
