Murderers Win State Paroles

RALEIGH, June 29.—(AP)—Six prisoners, three convicted of second degree murder, were paroled today by Governor Broughton. They were: Henry Lanier, convicted in Mecklenburg in 1937 of second degree murder and sentenced to 12 to 20 years; Rosa Bell Matthews, convicted in Lenoir in 1940 of second degree murder and sentenced to eight to 10 years; Posing Pack, convicted in Forsyth last March of store-breaking, larceny and receiving and sentenced to nine months; R. B. Gray, convicted in McDowell in 1941 of assault and battery with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and sentenced to six to nine years.
