GERMANY SUFFERS SHORTAGE OF FOOD

By HUNDSON PHILLIPS

NEW YORK, Dec. 3.- P-Germans "are suffering from the first real shortage of essential foods in this war" after being the best-fed civilians in Europe for almost five years, the American Institute of Food Distribution said yesterday.

Basing its predictions on government surveys and information from private sources, the non-profit research agency said:

"If German armies are able to continue resistance until next spring, their fighting men will not be delivered enough food all the time. Hunger will cut producing for war and add to present dis-

content among civilians. "Insufficient food and hunger were largely responsible for Germans quitting in 1918. Similar conditions will be appreciably worse during the next four months."

Here are the institute's reasons for Germany's plight: Imports from countries formerly occupied were cut off before 1944 harvests, leaving serious deficiencies of essential foods in Ger-
