11 WILL ANSWER LIQUOR CHARGES

Eleven persons were arrested Wednesday on a total of 28 indictments of violation of the liquor laws, as the result of a two-month investigation of illicit whiskey dealings by State Alcoholic Beverage Control board investigators.

The round-up included Negro bellhops, cafe employees, taxi drivers and others. The ABC agents lodged wholesale charges against the persons, from whom they had purchased whiskey in the past two months.

Each bottle was marked as an exhibit following its purchase. Earl S. Bland, chief ABC agent here, described the undercover drive as a customary practice that has been carried on here for the past 10 years. Two were conducted in 1944.

The defendants are Mamie Jackson Haywood, Negro of 508 Bay street, 2 charges of violations; Robert Johnson, Negro bellhop, two counts; Arthur Lee, Negro bellhop, four cases; Archie McKee, Negro of 705 McKee street, two counts; Rainey Page, Negro, New England cafe, three charges; Burl Scott, white, of Carolina Beach road, four counts; John Trammell, Negro, of 106 Mask alley, three; Paul Zimakas, white, New England cafe, four; Charles Baker, Negro of Carolina Beach road one; John King, Negro of 408 North Sixteenth, one; and Frank L. Smith, white, taxi driver of 510 Wrightsville Avenue, two.

Preliminary hearing has been postponed for most of the defendants until January 24.

FLUE-CURED GRADE PRICES ON TOBACCO UP IN MIDDLE BELT

By The Associated Press. Grade prices advanced again yesterday on the Middle Belt flue-cured tobacco markets, as the upward trend which commenced with the reopening of sales continued, but red and green leaf grades sold on the Old Belt continued to decline.

Averages for some of the better quality grades on the Middle Belt reached the highest levels this season. In comparison with Wednesday, most leaf grades were up \$1 to \$2. Cutters were \$1 higher and nondescript made gains up to \$3 per hundred. Lugs were mainly steady. Sales volume was light.

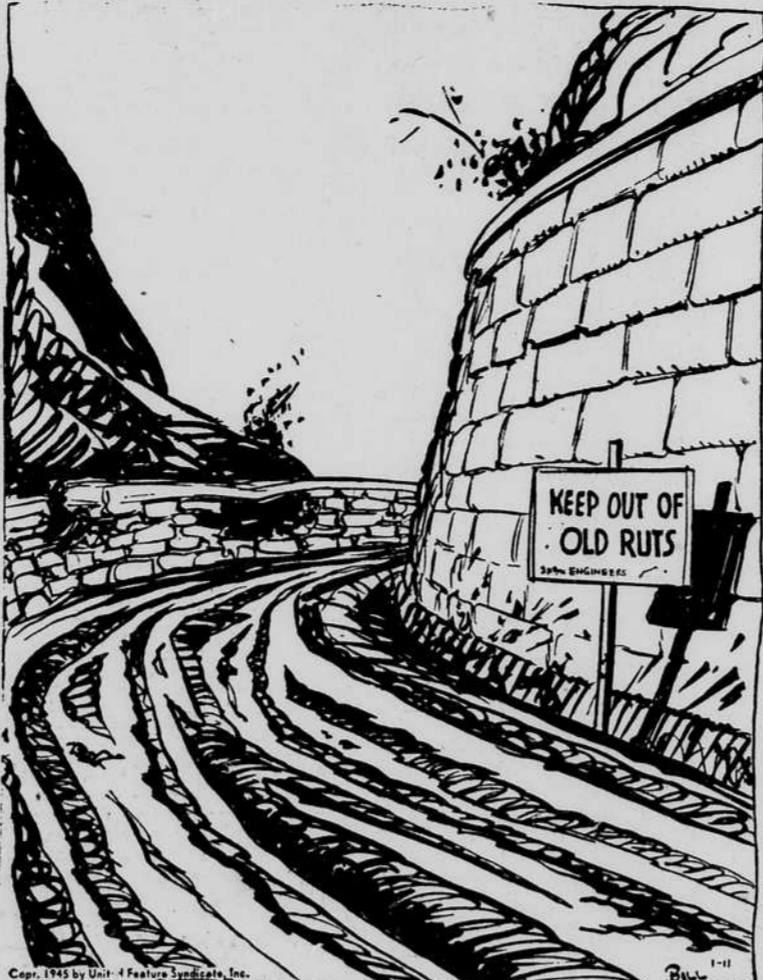
Wednesday's average was \$44.45 per hundred.

Pup Finds Soybean Base License Plates A Tasty Bit Of Eating

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Jan. 11.—(AP)—A pup of undetermined ancestry but with a notorious liking for soybean products in the form of 1944 Illinois license plates ran afoul of the law today.

Police Officer Lee Estrop spied the dog gnawing away at a license on a parked car and took the animal into custody. City Street Commissioner Frank Lock estimated it had destroyed 20 to 25 plates in three weeks.

Lock said the dog would be held for 10 days, awaiting an owner. It is friendly, and several offers of adoption have been made. No motorists complained the pup had eaten similarly-constructed 1945 plates, which legally should be on cars after January 1.

A Memphis, Tenn., woman reading of the dog's recent activities, suggested that the State put red pepper in the soy-plastic tags.

NOTED ART WORKS AT YALE DAMAGED

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Jan. 11.—(AP)—Four more Yale paintings were discovered today to have been damaged apparently, by vandals authorities said. Five others were defaced last Saturday.

The vandalism announced today was at the University's Peabody museum, the previous at the University Art Gallery, nearly a mile away.

Through the painting of Americus Vesputius, explorer and cartographer, a screw driver or knife had been driven. The painting was executed in 1575.

On the frame of a portrait of Col. George Gibbs, noted mathematician, an 1830 work by Gilbert Stuart, was carved "Hello Ma" and an obscenity.

Another portrait to suffer indignity was Daniel Huntington's picture of George Peabody, 1795-1867, founder of the museum. Various initials were carved into the heavy frame.

Attendants had been alerted after officials at the art gallery discovered two of the gallery's oils had been cut and three scribbled over in crayon.

There was no explanation of the vandalism.
