landed on Panay, 25th Philippine island invaded by the Americans, only last Sunday.

On Mindanao, the 41st Division easily beat off a Japanese counterattack and continued its advance north of Zamboanga. Guerrillas had controlled much of the big southern island before the American regulars landed March

From new bases on the liberated islands, American bombers continued their air blockade of the South China Sea.

Only two of the larger Philippines, Negros and Cebu, remained to be invaded by the American troops. They have been bombed repeatedly. Guerrillas have been active on both islands.

There was no estimate of the Japanese still fighting. MacArthur announced only last Sunday that 282,000, equivalent to eleven full divisions, had been killed or cap-
