## Third Army Captures Over 90,000 Germans In Drive For Rhine

WITH THE AMERICAN THIRD ARMY, Germany, March 23-(U.P.)-Lt. Gen. George S. Patton's Third Army in its drive to the Rhine has captured 90,000 to 95,000 German prisoners and taken 5,230 square miles of territory in which are 4,225 towns and villages.

Of the prisoners 60,000 to 65, 000 were taken since the Moselle was crossed March 13 and 43,-962 have been taken in the last seven days. At the Moselle, the Third Army faced elements of 27 Ger-

man divisions. Today it was es-

timated that about 10,000 Germans remained in the Rhine elbow west of the river. Since the Moselle was crossed the Third Army had knocked out guns, 5,00 motor vehicles, captured 1,000,000 rounds of ammunition, killed hundreds of hors-
