



"Staff Sergeant Savage was on outpost duty in a house with two seconds after the collision. other men when the position was attempting to enter the house, forcing them to retire. The enemy then threw in several hand grenades wounding Staff Sergeant Savage and one of the two defenders. When his two companions withdrew to another portion of the house the wounded sergeant left alone in the doorway, still continued the fire fight with the attackers so successfully that they were beaten off.
