# Mrs. Robinson Of Hospital Council, Selected As Field Representative

KINSTON, April 7.—Appointment of Mrs. John D. Robinson, of Wallace, former chairman of the Tar Heel Camp and Hospital Council of the American Red Cross, as council field representative, was announced Thursday at a regular meeting of the council held in the Community building at Kinston.

Mrs. James Thomas Little, of Greenville, council chairman, presided over the luncheon meeting at which Kinstonians were hosts. Richard N. Hart, Red Cross field director at Fort Bragg, acted in his temporary capacity as council secretary, and reported that Harold Aranoff would soon assume this position as Red Cross field director at Camp Davis.

Among the reports was an outstanding one made by Mrs. K. C. Pace, of Greenville, that Pitt county home demonstration club members had sent 10,925 cookies and many flowers to Camp Lejeune for naval hospital patients on Easter. Plans were made for other committees and home demonstration clubs to send cookies and flowers to Lejeune patients on Mother's Day, and Mrs. Little was authorized to appoint for this permanent purpose a representative of home demonstration clubs to serve as a member of the council's executive board.

Officers for the next year will be elected at a meeting to be held the last part of May in Jacksonville. Mrs. Little named a nominating committee composed of Mrs. J. H. B. Moore, of Greenville, Miss Gertrude Carraway, of New Bern, and Mrs. British Long, of Kinston.

Invocation at the chicken salad luncheon was by Chaplain J. R. Thomas of the Kinston air field. Mrs. Wesley Espey, executive secretary of the Kinston Red Cross chapter, introduced the Kinston-

ans present, and C. Kersey Smith, Kinston chapter and war fund chairman, spoke briefly. Another speaker was W. M. Boice, of Whiteville, former council chairman.

Camp Lejeune hospital representatives asked for gifts of walking canes, fishing poles, plane models, ship models, potted plants and shrubs for patients. Mrs. C. F. Harvey, of Kinston, donated her large collection of canes, and promised enough bamboo shoots from her gardens to serve as fishing poles.

In response to a request from Cherry Point for five radios, four used radios were offered. Plans were made to assist with various Red Cross service for Camp Davis, which was said to be getting ready for its new work as a rehabilitation and redistribution center for Army Air Forces convalescents.

After the luncheon and business session, those attending were taken on a moto tour of the Kinston airfield, which is an auxiliary facility of the Marine air station at Cherry Point.
