120 RECLASSIFIED BY DRAFT BOARD

Reclassification from 2-A and 2-B into 1-A of 120 white and Negro registrants between the ages of 26 and 30 has been completed by City Draft Board No. 1, officials announced yesterday.

Induction in May and June of one-third of this number can be expected, draft officials said, as the men already have successfully stood pre-induction physical tests.

The others of these draft-eligibles are scheduled to take pre-induction examinations, incident to induction, in May and June, it was said.

Reclassification by the city board started April 1 in the case of its 2-A and 2-B registrants who had not filed a DSS Form 42-A (special revised) approved by an appropriate Federal agency.

Registrants unable to supply a request for deferment which has been approved by a Federal agency can "expect to be drafted," officials said. The classification of additional registrants is continuing.

The 15 white men the city board will send off for induction on April 25 are of "various" age groups, it was said.

Induction and pre-induction calls for next month are as follows: Induction of 20 white men May 24.

Pre-induction physical tests for 25 white men May 3.

Induction call for 21 Negroes May 19.

Pre-induction examinations for 30 Negroes May 17.

STOCKS DECLINE UNDER SELLING

NEW YORK, April 19.—(AP)—Expressed by relatively heavy late profit selling on the sharp 7-session upswing, the stock market averages today suffered the first decline since April 9.

Transfers of 1,680,000 shares compared with 1,710,000 Wednesday.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .4 of a point at 63.9. It was another broad market, 982 issues appearing. Of these, 483 were down, 295 up and 204 unchanged.

Secondary railway bonds were resistant. Cotton was 10 cents a bale higher to 30 cents lower.

In the Curb, Colt's Patent Firearms was up 1.2 and Eversharp 2. Mimus marks were attached to Electric Bond and Share, Cities Service and F. L. Jacobs. Turn-over here was 400,000 shares versus 390,000 yesterday.
