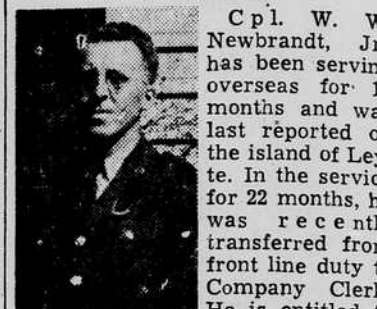

Senator Suggests Award Of Honor To Ernie Pyle

WASHINGTON, April 20.—(AP)—Posthumous award of the Congressional Medal of Honor to Ernie Pyle, Scripps-Howard columnist killed on Ie Jima, was proposed in a resolution introduced in the Senate today by Senator Willis (R-Ind.).

The senator said Pyle was "as much a part of America as Mark Twain, or the corner drugstore, or the church in every town."

Senators Capahart (R-Ind.), Hatch (D-NM), and Chavez (D-NM) joined Willis in sponsoring the resolution.
