PLOT TO CAPTURE LONDON REVEALED

18TH AIRBORNE CORPS HEADQUARTERS, Belgium, Dec. 23.—(Delayed)—U.P.—Two American army captains disclosed to night the fantastic details of a German plot to capture London Christmas Eve by a jailbreak of 75,000 Nazi war prisoners in England. The prisoners were to be aided by paratroops and seaborne infantry and their breakout was to be launched with an order of the day by Adolf Hitler proclaiming: "The hour of our liberation is approaching."

STOCKS REGISTER LOSING SESSION

NEW YORK, May 10.—(P)—The stock market registered its fourth successive losing session today as apprehension persisted over reconversion, cutbacks and the reported move in Washington to reduce war agency expenditures by billions. Transfers of 1,510,000 shares compared with 1,490,000 Wednesday. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .7 of a point at 63.8, widest drop since April 26. Of 971 issues appearing, 695 were down, 123 up and 153 unchanged. Prominent on the retreat were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Santa Fe, Great Northern, General Motors, Chrysler, Goodrich, Montgomery Ward, International Harvester, American Telephone, Standard Oil (N.J.), Texas Co., American Smelting, Du Pont, American Can, Allied Chemical, Johns-Manville, Eastman Kodak, U. S. Gypsum and Secondary railway bonds softened. Owens-Illinois. Cotton was unchanged to 70 cents a bale lower. Among curb backsliders were cities service, aluminum of America, Pantepec and Electric Bond and Lambert, United Stores and Raytheon. Turnover here was 860, and Share. Ahead were Clayton 900 shares vs 370,000 yesterday.

Hollis Attends Meeting Of County Welfare Heads

J. R. Hollis, New Hanover county welfare superintendent is attending a four day course on problems and policies of public welfare administration in Raleigh this week with other county superintendents. The course is given as part of the staff development program of the State Department of Public Welfare under the direction of Anna A. Cassatt. A summary and analysis of recent legislation was given by Dr. Ellen Winston, State welfare commissioner. Among other subjects discussed were boarding homes for aged persons, phases of the child welfare program, public assistance procedures, mental hygiene, and personnel policies and procedures.

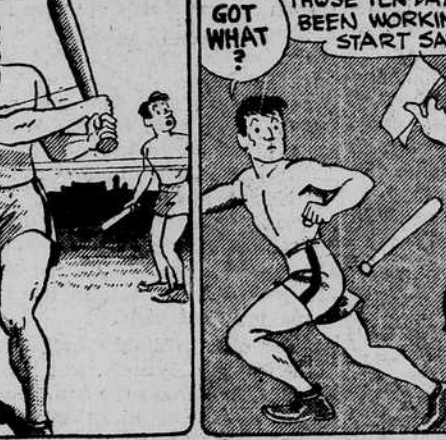
'ARTIFICIAL SPRING' WORKS
