

### POLISH QUESTION RAISED BY EDEN

SAN FRANCISCO, May 10.—(AP)—British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden said today the 16 Polish leaders arrested by Russia included "nearly all the leading figures of the Polish underground movement."

Many of those arrested, he said, were persons the British thought should be included in a new, Democratic Warsaw government.

Speaking at a jam-packed news conference, Eden also reviewed the work of the United Nations toward creating a world security organization and predicted that the problem of fitting in regional arrangements would be worked out, although "I don't yet see a solution."

He said that the solution should be built upon the principle that "regional pacts are extremely valuable in strengthening a world organization, but regional pacts can not replace it."

Among the big power amendments to the Dumbarton Oaks plan on which conference committees now are moving forward, Eden stressed especially one which he said would give the proposed world security council authority to "definitely recommend how a dispute threatening the peace can be settled and no great power can by its veto prevent such a recommendation being made."

Dapper and smiling, Eden opened the conference at noon (PWT) by saying that the British delegation had sometimes wished very much in the last day or two to be at home, especially in London, because of what that battered capital has experienced in the way of war destruction.

### YANKS IN PERSIAN GULF AREA MOVED

WASHINGTON, May 10.—(AP)—Service troops already have been shifted to China from the Persian Gulf area where they helped supply the Soviet army, the Army disclosed today.

A huge truck convoy, commanded by Col. Paul R. Guthrie of (1530 Kearney St.) Denver, Colo., made the 6,000-mile trek from the Persian desert to the Kunning, China, supply center in what was described as "record time."

The convoy travelled by sea, rail and highway. The first leg of the journey from the Persian desert to Calcutta, India, was made aboard ship. From Calcutta the convoy was carried on railroad cars to the Ledo terminus of the Stilwell highway. From there, it rolled under its own power over the highway to Kunning. Every vehicle arrived intact.

The movement, it was revealed, was planned long in advance—even before the Japs were driven from North Burma and before the Stilwell road was opened.

### DEMOBILIZATION SCORE FOR ARMY

WASHINGTON, May 10.—(AP)—Here's how P. I. Joe can figure his eligibility for discharge under the Army's point system.

Suppose he's been in the Army 36 months. He gets 36 points under service credit.

For 18 months he's been overseas and that adds another 18 points to his score.

He's won the Silver Star and the Purple Heart and has taken part in three major campaigns recognized officially with battle stars. Each of those awards is worth five points, so he gets another 15 points.

Back home he has a five year old daughter. She's worth 12 points, since she's under 18.

So, striking a balance, the soldier gets a total score of 91 points. It takes only 85 points to qualify for release, so he can count on going home unless he's an exceptionally skilled man for whom no replacement can be found immediately. But he has the army's assurance that every effort will be made to obtain a replacement for him.

### Savannah River Bill Will Be Introduced

WASHINGTON, May 10.—(AP)—Chairman John H. Overton, D., La., of a Senate Commerce subcommittee on flood control, announced today that the committee will start hearings June 10 on a bill to establish a Savannah river authority.

The bill was introduced by Sens. Richard B. Russell, D., Ga., and Burnet R. Maybank, D., S. C.
