More Sugar In Sight For U. S. Consumers

WASHINGTON, June 25.—(AP)—Prospect of more sugar for U. S. consumers brightened today. Rep. Clinton P. Anderson, D., N. M., who becomes Secretary of Agriculture July 1, announced that Cuba has promised the bulk of its sugar production to the United States. He said this country plans to send Cuba farm machinery and fertilizer to boost production. Gov. Ingram M. Stainback of the Hawaiian Islands authorized Hawaiian growers to import 6,000 Filipino laborers and predicted a production increase which would mean an additional one and one quarter pounds of sugar for each U. S. resident.
