RAILS, UTILITIES REGISTER GAINS

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—(P)—Selected rails and utilities gained ground in the bond market today surviving a late flurry of activity which wiped out a number of advances and left some early gainers at low-er levels.

Industrials finished with only fractional chances. Sales of 5,790,000 compared with Monday's 5,490,000. St. Paul adjustment 5s after touching 28 1/4 skidded to close at 27, off a point, but the 5s of 1975 gained 1/2 to close at 82 1/4.

NEW YORK COTTON NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—(P)—Cotton futures were under pressure today as profit taking and hedge selling followed sharp advances in the two previous sessions.

There was further liquidation in October following issuances of nine additional transferable notices. Hedge selling increased and checked early rallying tendencies in the market.
