Eddie Cameron Makes Statement For Duke

DURHAM, Nov. 25. -(AP)-Eddie Cameron, head coach of the Duke Blue Devils, said in a formal statement today that the southern Conference football champions would not play in a New Year's day bowl game because of a heavy academic schedule facing many of the

Cameron's statement, issued by the Duke University news service, said:

"Duke university has not received an invitation to any bowl. Our season is ended. Even if we had been approached, which we were not, we could not have considered it because of the heavy scholastic schedule facing several of our players."

Coach Cameron's denial that Duke had been invited to play in a post season game was the second he had made within 24 hours. The first came last night when a wire association story quoted unnamed Duke officials that the Blue Devils had received bids to both the Sugar and Cotton bowls. Cameron branded that statement as false and his statement today ended all speculation.


