**DIES WHEN SUPPLY** OF DRUG RUNS OUT PEIPING, Dec. 27 -(P)- Wang

Ceh-min, leading North China colaborator with the Japanese, died in the military prison here Christmas Day of an illness which local newspapers asserted resulted from his inability to obtain opium, to which he was said to have been addicted. 1

Official biographies differ as to whether Wang was 66 or 70 years old. A native of Hangchow, he was educated in Japan, served there five years as counselor of the old Chinese Imperial Legation, and later was Finance Minister and held other high posts in the Chinese republic.

In 1937, when the Japanese invaded North China, Wang came out of retirement to head the Japanese-sponsored provisional government. In 1939, when the Japanese established a puppet rule over all occupied China, he became chair-man of North China political affairs. He retired prior to the Japanese surrender, but was arrested on a treason charge Dec. 5.
