He certainly did not realize at the beginning that the White House has now become itself a department of government. The Presidency is not just a man with some secretaries and some clerks. It is the central department of the government where all other departments meet, and have to be guided, corrected, superintended, and made a team. This requires a White House staff of men who are so able and so verselect the issues the President himself must decide, and can prepare the issues so that he can know

enough to decide them. Now while Mr. Truman saw the need to reorganize the Cabinet and to use it, he did not see that he needed also to make the White House itself an efficient department. 
