

MAJ. JULIAN SMITH GIVEN NEW BASE

CAMP LEJUENE, Jan. 17.—Maj. Gen. Julian C. Smith, USMC, who was commanding general here from October 1, 1942, until June, 1943, and who recently has served as commanding general of the department of the Pacific with headquarters at San Francisco, will become commandant of the Marine Barracks at Parris Island, S. C., succeeding Maj. Gen. Clayton B. Vogel, who was transferred this month to the retired list for physical disability.

commanding general of the Second Marine Division, which was awarded a presidential citation for outstanding heroism and success in the capture of Tarawa in the Gilbert islands.

After graduating from the University of Delaware, he was appointed a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps in 1909. His military career has been diversified and colorful, with service in Cuba, Haiti, Mexico, Nicaragua, England and the Pacific.

In being assigned to duty in South Carolina, General Smith returns to the native state of Mrs. Smith.

MERCHANTS SEEK UNIFORM HOURS

A survey of members of the Merchants' board of the Wilmington Chamber of Commerce with a view of establishing a uniform closing hour for establishments in the city was decided upon yesterday at a meeting of the group in the Woodrow Wilson Hut. Also discussed by the meeting was the downtown parking problem encountered by shoppers.

Clarence L. Harris, manager of Woolworth's Five-and-Ten-cent store, who presided at the meeting, brought out the fact some stores were closing at 6 o'clock on Saturday nights, while other stores were remaining open until 7 p. m.

He suggested, and it met with the approval of the group, a survey of all downtown merchants that a suitable hour might be set for merchants who were members of the Retail Merchant's association.

Harris, after appointing George Hunt, of the Pender Furniture store, and Robert S. Dannenbaum, manager of the Thrift-T Stores, Inc., to formulate a questionnaire, agreed to have employees of his store to conduct the survey at which time managers would be given a chance to voice their opinion as to what closing hour should be adopted.

Parking facilities of Wilmington came in for a lengthy discussion by the group. It was contended that local merchants were losing trade of persons who were forced to drive to other towns to do their shopping due to lack of downtown parking space.

A suggestion was made by John M. Farrell, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, that an educational program aimed at the consumer and shopper might be a partial answer to the situation.

Members of the board declared the situation was one which should be remedied and declared a full survey into possible answers would be made.
