**Religious Training Termed Constitutional**

CHAMPAIGN, Ill., Jan. 26—U.P.—A three-judge court ruled today that religious teaching on a voluntary basis in public schools was constitutional and that an avowed woman atheist who had sought to halt such training suffered no infringement on her rights.

The court rejected the petition of Mrs. Vashti McCollum, pretty wife of a University of Illinois horticulture professor, that the Champaign public schools be ordered to halt the half-hour Bible lessons conducted by the city council on religious education during school hours.

The court held there was no infringement of the statutory rights of Mrs. McCollum or her son, James Terry, 10, whom she had refused to let attend the classes. She had charged he suffered embarrassment because of his mother's refusal to let him join the classes.

**World Police Force Advocated By Compton**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—(U.P.)—Dr. Arthur H. Compton, winner of the noble prize for physics, tonight urged all nations to surrender their right to make war by putting the atomic bomb and every other weapon of mass destruction exclusively in the hands of an international police force.

Compton, head of the Oak Ridge, Tenn., atomic bomb laboratories, spoke at a public forum meeting sponsored by the Washington Chapter of the American Veterans committee. Another speaker was Rep. Jerry Voorhis, D., Calif.

"The release of atomic energy means that wars must cease, Compton said. "We must work toward placing all major war-making power, including in particular the use of atomic weapons, in the hands of a world organization that will serve as police to prevent wars between nations."
