





FOREIGN-OWNED **ASSETS ON RISE**

Deposits In United States Banks Total 373 Millions Of Dollars

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23- (AP) Foreign - owned assets in the United States rose throughout America's first three years of war to a total of \$14,000,000,000 by the start of 1945, the Treasury disclosed to-

Foreign - owned dollar assets, not counting gold earmarked before Pearl Harbor. At the same time, the Treasury

said in a statement supplementing its report on a June, 1941, census taking, gold in the U.S. earmarked for foreign account more than doubled, jumping from \$1,916,000,000 to \$3,937,000,000.

Foreign deposits in U. S. banks ncreased by \$373,000,000, while foreign countries bought more than \$1,250,000,000 of short - term and \$120,000,000 in long - term securities of the U. S. government.


